5. How long will it take to accomplish the task?
6. What will cluster "success" look like?
7. If the cluster will exist for more than one year what is the set of tasks to be accomplished within the next year?
8. What are some important calendar dates for the cluster?
9. How often will the cluster meet as cluster size? Where?
10. How will cells be formed within the cluster?
11. How will APEPT gifts/leaders be discerned and deployed within the cluster?
12. What resources will the cluster need and where will they be found?
13. Will the cluster have partner clusters?
